

BCU LEVEL 3 COACH ASSESSMENT - Kayak

REMEMBER YOU HAVE TO REGISTER YOUR INTENTION TO DO THIS COURSE WITH THE BCU, FOLLOWING THEIR MANDATORY C1 PROCEDURE.

What Paperwork Is Required?

When you meet your trainers on the **arrival evening at 2000hrs**, they will want to see the following **original paper work**. Please ensure all this is sorted out so we can get onto the water promptly.

- Form C1 **signed + stamped by BCU - without this, you'll be turned away from the course.**
- BCU/SCA/CANI/WCA comprehensive (full) membership.
- Your Log Book with evidence of a minimum of 30 hours logged teaching experience since training (NO LOG BOOK, NO COURSE)
- A C2 form from the BCU (which should come with the completed C1).
- Your **ORIGINAL** Certificates:
 - 4 Star Award in the relevant discipline.
 - Level 3 Training Course Certificate within the last 3 years (or letter of exemption).
 - Current First Aid Certificate (8 hour including CPR and EAV)
- Completed written question paper (**attached**).

The Assessment

You will be assessed on equipment checks, personal skills, group leadership, access and the environment and coaching techniques on moving water at around Grade 2.

Mock students will be recruited for the second day to give you "real" students to coach.

You are asked to **prepare a relevant short lecturette** of your own choice lasting no more than ten minutes. Your target audience is a group of 4 Star level students, so please make it relevant for this. We have all kinds of presentation facilities here, including Power Point, but you may choose to give your lecturette on the water (content is more important than using fancy systems).

What Will I Need?
